Program Goal #1:

This goal is no longer in use due to changes in federal legislation- EO 14148/14151 and EO 14173 - and updated accreditation standards.

Program Goal #2 (New Goal #1)

Recruit qualified applicants who successfully complete medical education as a physician assistant

Outcome measure: Admissions and enrollment

Benchmark: Achieve 95% enrollment with each class

Strength benchmark: Achieve 100% enrollment with each class

Results: ARC-PA approved maximum class size increased from 30 (2022–2023) to 60 (2024), reflecting institutional growth and capacity enhancement. The program has consistently filled all available seats, with enrollment exceeding the approved class size due to the return of decelerated students completing the program. This reflects a strong institutional capacity to support returning learners and high applicant demand through effective recruitment strategies. These numbers (over maximum class size) do not indicate over-enrollment but rather the student's desire to return and complete the program - a commitment to student success and persistence.

Results:

 Graduation Rates: Though the goal was not met for the Class of 2022, the goal was met in all subsequent classes. These rates reflect strong academic support and student persistence across cohorts.

Academic Attrition Rates: Even with program expansion, attrition remained within acceptable limits, indicating robust student engagement and institutional support.

Outcome measure: Summative medical knowledge

• **OSCE Pass Rates:** Between 94–100% of students passed all components on the first attempt, indicating high levels of clinical skill proficiency across cohorts.

Outcome measure: Students' rating of clinical preparation on exit survey

Benchmark: Average score of ≥ 4.5 out of 5 on all 11 domains measured relating to clinical preparation on exit survey

Exit Survey Feedback:

Graduating students from 2021, 2023, and 2024 rated their clinical preparation ≥ 4.5 out
of 5 on all 11 domains measured, further validating the program's effectiveness in
preparing practice-ready graduates.

Program Goal #4 (New Goal # 3)

Maintain PANCE pass rates above the national average

Outcome measure: First-time PANCE pass rate

Benchmark: First-time PANCE pass rate ≥ national average (typically ~92%).

Results:

• **2022:** 100% (↑ national average)

• **2023**: 93% (↑ national average)

• **2024:** 81% (\(\) national average)

Contextual Factors:

The Class of 2024 was the first to experience a combination of increased class size (from 30 to 60), a redesigned curriculum, and a newly integrated faculty. These systemic transitions may have contributed to the dip in first-time pass rates. In response, the program is conducting

ongoing curricular evaluation and targeted academic support initiatives to realign outcomes with historical trends.

The Class of 2025 PANCE first-time pass rate currently sits at 62/65 or 95% which is above the national average to date.

Program Goal #5 (New Goal #4)

Educate physician assistant students to be integral members of the interprofessional team to serve our community and meet its educational and healthcare needs

Outcome Measure: Participation in interprofessional events

Benchmark: 100% students participate in 75% (3 out of 4) interprofessional events in the didactic year.

Results:

- 2020–2023: All students (30 per class) participated in 75% to 100% of the interprofessional events with the Pioneer Valley Interprofessional Education Collaborative (PV-IPEC), including: rough:
 - Ethics Cases
 - o To Er Is Human
 - Poverty Simulation
 - HCC Mega Code (Nursing, EMS)
- 2024–2025: All students (30 per class) participated in 75% to 100% of the interprofessional events with the Pioneer Valley Interprofessional Education Collaborative (PV-IPEC). With the cohort size doubling to 60 students, participation scaled accordingly. The IPE curriculum was further enhanced through:
 - o To Err is Human
 - IPE Day Standardized patient simulation
 - o 2023: Launch of Virtual Patient Encounters
 - 2024: Introduction of Geriatric and Disability IPE in collaboration with Occupational Therapy

Outcome measure: Competency in interprofessional principles based on course assessments

Benchmark: 100% of students score ≥80% on interprofessional collaboration-related assessments within PAS 503 and PAS 513 Professional and Psychosocial Aspects of Healthcare I and II.

Rationale: Interprofessional principles are embedded longitudinally in the *Professional and Psychosocial Aspects of Health Care* course series, ensuring that students are consistently exposed to the collaborative competencies necessary for modern healthcare delivery.
