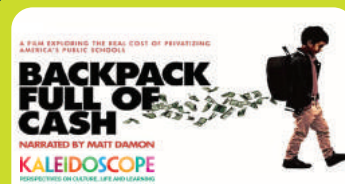

**Berkshire Chamber Players With Dancers**

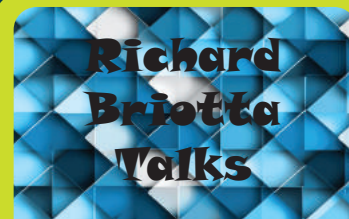
For the first time, the Berkshire Chamber Players present an evening featuring original choreography to music that was not written with dance in mind.
